

JAMES ORMSTON BURNS began making guitars in the early 60s and soon his innovative designs were being used by all the influential musicians of the day

These included: Hank Marvin, Elvis Presley, George Harrison, Marc Bolan, Jimmy Page, Mark Knopfler, Brian May, Tom Petty, Status Quo and Slade - to name but a few.

Burns designs were always ahead of their time and Jim's ideas have now become standard with many other guitar makers. These include the heelless glued-in neck, the 24 fret fingerboard, knifeedge bearing vibrato units, active electronics and stacked-coil pickups

In 1992 the Burns London company was re-established to manufacture authentic reproductions of the original and now very desirable guitars. The designs chosen for the re-issues represent the very best of the original guitars and have been painstakingly reproduced.

Many of the components have had to be purpose made and sourced – often from the same suppliers who made components for the original guitars.

However technology now allows us to make guitars that are more accurate and better finished. Body and neck timbers are far superior whilst the hardware has improved measurably both in quality and performance.

There's never been a better time to buy a Burns guitar. With new and limited editions being introduced regularly, you'll find one that's made for



Burns® Rez-o-Matik® ENR (Entwistle Noise Reduction).

Developed by Alan Entwistle (pictured) over the last ten years but not released until this year when Alan was finally happy he had developed a pickup that truly captured the unique single coil tone structure characteristic of the Rez-o-Matik®.

The Rez-o-Matik® ENR is uniquely different to other noiseless single coil systems, as it is actually developed from a full size Rez-o-Matik® single coil, using the same magnets and winding as the original.

New pickup fitted to the Marvin and Bison 64 models

The new Burns® Rez-o-Matik® single coils are now made by Entwistle electronics, it has been recently discovered that the original 1964 Burns® Rez-o-Matiks® had an unusual winding pattern that in combination with the Rez-o-Tube® bridge, gave the Marvin and Bison 64 their unique sound.

Burns® Tri-Sonic® pickups fitted to Bison, Bison Bass, Marquee Bass, Double Six, Double Six Apache, Barracuda, Shadow

The Burns® Tri-Sonic® pickup stands alone in delivering it's famous 'singing' tone, and this achievment was no accident when the pickup was designed back in 1960 by Jim Burns and his team, in fact it is testament to just how far thinking these guys were.

The secret of the Tri-Sonic® lies in its magnetic circuit, which is designed to actually fold around the pickups coil, resulting in a fuller, wider frequency, harmonically rich tonescape.

New Mini Tri-Sonic® pickup fitted to the new Cobra

The new Mini Tri-Sonic® pickup delivers the same power and tone as the original larger Tri-Sonic®. Adrian Turner, of Adeson, developed a unique slimline version of the original 1960's Tri-Sonic® pickup – crafted and engineered for a standard more traditional S/S/S pickguard configuration, utilising all the original style build methods with scaled-down base-plates and compensated chromed brass covers.

New Burns® Rez-o-Tone™ fitted to the Bison 64

This is a five way rotary tone selector that preselects and filters various frequencies from any of the pickups combinations, it is not a tone control in the normal sense of the word, as all the selections are useful reflections of various vintage sounds, and acoustic textures.

The Burns® Rez-o-Tone™ was developed and manufactured by Entwistle Electronics, and is fitted to the current Bison 64 Rez-o-Tube® model.

Burns® Gear-o-Matik® Gearbox



This Burns® gearbox was first designed by Jim Burns in 1960 to allow fine neck setting. Coupled to the steel truss rod tensioned through the neck to a

gearbox with a hefty cog and worm which provides micro adiustment

Hank Marvin says about the Burns Marvin 1964...

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Some guitarists think of the USA as the only source of quality electric guitars, and for the most part they are correct. However, there are many of us who remember the superb range of guitars designed and made by Burns London, a British company.

Back in 1963, Jim Burns, the founder of the Company, worked closely with myself and Bruce Welch of The Shadows to design a guitar which would have the style, sound, and playability we required. Together we developed the 'Burns Marvin' a fine guitar, which I played on record, stage and screen from 1964 thru to 1970 when, unfortunately, my guitars were stolen, never to be seen again, well not by me!

I am delighted that Burns London are still in the business of making quality instruments, and in particular the new 'Burns Marvin'.

Playing this new 'Marvin' brings back a host of memories; such as the recording of 'The Rise and Fall of Flingel Bunt', together with many other Shadows tracks I recorded with my Burns.

The new 'Burns Legend' plays superbly and I am very happy to be the proud owner of one of these fine quitars, it plays and sounds as good as my original

With the complete success of the Aniversary Marvin Signature Guitar we are now delighted to offer the long awaited matching Shadows bass guitar as a special edition.



This special instrument has been remade to the exact specifications from the original bass used by John Rostill of the Shadows.

Burns® London acquired the original Shadows bass in 2005 which inspired us to re-release this great guitar as a special edition.

Close research revealed this bass was quite different to the production model of 1964. The electrics are custom wired to give a wider range of pickup selections. As well as various cosmetic changes including headstock size, pickup spacing and selector switch angle.

In 1964 a bar type bridge was fitted to all Burns® basses. To improve tuning and intonation we have used four separate bridge saddles while retaining the original Burns Rez-o-Tube® bridge unit.


